
UACCB Information Resources



UACCB Financial Aid

Amount of Book Assistance

\$65,239 in books was awarded to students qualifying for the Arkansas Book Scholars Award. Additionally, \$1,954 in books was awarded in the Chancellor Book Awards and \$2,510 in books was awarded in Employee Book Awards.

Institutional Scholarships for the 2014-15 academic year

383 (23%) received a UACCB institutional scholarship totaling \$286,039.



UACCB has 11 buildings on 58 acres. The total square footage of buildings is 162,044 square feet on-site. UACCB has an off-site facility in Cushman, where classes have been offered since Fall 2011. The newest building on campus is the Cosmetology Building, which is a 5,200-square-foot facility that houses a full-service salon that provides services to the public.
